Choice Neighborhoods is a U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) grant program that provides funding to develop and implement community-supported plans to redevelop distressed public housing and improve the surrounding neighborhood.

One-for-one replacement of all existing public housing units with high-quality, mixed-income housing that is well managed and responsive to needs.

Supportive services for target housing residents that address needs and improve outcomes related to employment and income, health, and education.
